#### 2019-2020 School Year Update

Parents are asking great questions about next year's change to being a K-6 elementary campus:



- Q. I have friends who have been trying to get into APA for years. Will they be able to get in next year?
- A. West Valley 1 will be adding another class of each K-6 grade and so we will have more available seats than we've had for the last 9 years. Tell your friends and family members to be sure to apply online in time for the first lottery selection. The online application will be available around Thanksgiving weekend and the first lottery will be in December. Exact dates will be announced soon.
- Q. My friends with Junior High students think they will just wait until next year to get into APA. How will the transfer of Junior High to WV2 affect this?
- A. With all our secondary students moving to WV2, it will be more difficult for new secondary students to get in. But if they enroll in APA this year, they are guaranteed to be part of that transfer. We have a few junior high seats still available, so if they are serious about being part of APA, now is a great time to have them come check out the school.
- Q. Are there still seats available in elementary?
- A. Not right now. If students leave during the school year, we will fill those empty seats. But right now our elementary classes are full. You might suggest this to your friends and family who have some location flexibility: Enroll for this year at a Draper campus. The Draper campuses still have room for this year. Once enrolled, students can apply for a transfer for the 2019-2020 school year. If they attend Draper this year, they have a very good chance of transferring to West Valley 1 next year if they still want to.
- Q. When my 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> grade student moves to WV2, can I transfer the rest of my children there as well?

  A. Each year there are a few spaces that become available for elementary transfers to WV2. There will be an online link available before the end of Term 2 to get on the waitlist for a transfer. Sometimes it takes a couple years for a transfer to happen. The good news for our families driving between both campuses—the start times are staggered by 15 minutes to allow adequate travel time between WV2 and WV1. Fortunately, the campuses are only 3.5 miles from each other.

## Fresh Fruits & Vegetables - Red Raspberries & Fennel/Anise

Raspberries were first introduced into cultivation in Europe nearly 450 years ago. By the early nineteenth century, more than 20 cultivars of red raspberry were grown in both England and the USA. Raspberries are a composite fruit traditionally available in mid-summer, but with new harvesting innovations they can be enjoyed all year long. Berries are mature when they have completely developed their characteristic color, and are easily detached from the plant. Almost all of the crops are processed. Only 10% of the crop is sold fresh. Red raspberries are delicate, sweet and slightly tart, containing lower sugar content compared to other fruits.

Fennel is an herb that grows 3 feet to 10 feet tall. The plant contains thick, ribbed, hollow stems that grow from its rooted bulb, similar looking to a celery stalk. Green feather like branches grow off of the stems. Every part of the Fennel plant is edible, and surprisingly enough, this vegetable tastes like black licorice. The bulb of the plant is the most desired part, as it is juicy and succulent with heavy accents of the licorice flavor. Fennel is used in cooking recipes, but is best eaten raw on salads or in other fresh dishes. Another name for Fennel is Anise.

## **JUNIOR HIGH NEWS**

## Secondary Attendance School/Saturday School - At WV2 - 3636 W 3100 S, WVC

Daily attendance is key for your student's success. Because our students are learning from the moment they step into the classroom until the moment they leave, it is vital that students be on time for class. We understand that occasionally things happen due to human imperfections. We allow the students up to 3 tardies in each class period each term without penalty. However, after the 3rd tardy, your student will not be able to receive credit (NG) in that class until they correct the tardy through Attendance School, also known as Saturday School. For each tardy over 3, the students must spend 30 minutes in Saturday school. For each 30 minutes, they need to pay \$5.00 to cover the costs of holding attendance school. Therefore, if your student has 7 tardies in 1st period, they must make up 4 of those tardies which equals 2 hours in Saturday School and \$20.00. Once your student has made up their tardies, we will remove the NG and they will be able to receive credit for that class. Saturday school is held at our WV2 campus on October 13th. Your student must be in FULL UNIFORM including their NAMETAG with their SCHOOL WORK by 8am. The doors open at 7:40 and will lock at 7:55. They will not be admitted after the doors lock. Your student should come to the Jr. High foyer to check in and pay. Your student can leave as soon as they have made up their time. Each Saturday the students may stay until 11am. If they did not make up all of their tardies on one Saturday, they must return the next Saturday. If you have questions, please contact the Jr. High Office.
