# *January Builder Theme:* I am a Builder When I Work Diligently

Welcome to a new 2022 year and welcome to Term 3! The school year is progressing so rapidly! Please note the Term 3 dates and events in the calendar above. Also, at the end of the newsletter, you will find the <u>2022-2023</u> school calendar. Please use that as you are calendaring your family plans for next year.

December was a busy month! We had our first "inclement weather" indoor carpool AND our first "inclement weather" remote learning day! What an opportunity to test these procedures and give everyone (students, parents, staff) a chance to practice them. Great job to all of you who helped make those successful. A couple of take-aways:



- 1. **Indoor/Inclement Weather carpool**. Here's how it works. Students stay in their classrooms and are released when their family/carpool number is posted. Carpool tags, visible, are <u>always</u> a requirement for pickup and, in this case, make the process of taking numbers quick and easy. Our carpool on that blustery, snowy day took almost 45 minutes! That is unnecessarily long. Here's how you can help:
  - Be certain you have given tags to all of your regular pickup drivers
  - Be certain that you have a photo of your carpool tag on your phone so that in an emergency, you can share and the driver picking up your student can verify that they are authorized to take your student.
  - If you believe you have not received carpool tags, please stop by the office to get replacements.
- 2. *Remote Learning.* It was delightful to see your students learning on their zoom meetings with the teachers on December 15. We have a list of kinks to smooth out, but were pleased by the success of the day for so many of our students. If your family was not successful in "attending" school on that snowy Wednesday or came to the school in the morning and were surprised to find an empty parking lot—here are two important things you can do:
  - Be sure that you have given the school (on Skyward) an email address that you check regularly.
  - And then... well...check it regularly. <sup>(i)</sup> If we determine that weather conditions require a remote learning day, this information will be posted on the website and sent via email by 6:30am. Notifications come by email and instructions from the homeroom teachers for the day will also come by email.

Please remember that new kindergarten students must be 5 on or before September 1st to qualify for enrollment; there are no exceptions to this rule.
