## <u>May Builder Theme:</u> <u>I am a Builder When I Am Utterly Reliable</u>

This month's Builder theme is about being utterly reliable. <u>UTTERLY</u> reliable. Completely. Absolutely. That's the definition for utterly. Builders are utterly reliable. They can be depended on to do what they say they will do, to follow through with their commitments, to communicate quickly and clearly if they aren't able to keep a commitment, and to be in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing. As you discuss this month's theme with your children, point out the ways you strive to be utterly reliable in your interactions. Acknowledge their efforts and help them recognize the ways they are becoming utterly reliable. Builders are utterly reliable!

### Parent Survey Completion—THIS HAS BEEN A WORKOUT!

Thank you to all of you parents who completed your surveys...some of you multiple times! As of the writing of this newsletter, we are at 58.35% completion in the "general" survey (one per family) and we are at 77.62% completion in the second part of the survey, the "teacher" survey (one per student). For technical reasons that we just don't have answers for, some of you still show partial completion or no completion. If you are willing, we would like to make one more big push to try and match or beat our 96% success from last year. You will receive a text and/or email with your links from the district. PLEASE take a screenshot of your final page that thanks you for completing it. Only parents who are not recorded as "complete" will receive this communication.

### <u>Households that Qualify for Free or Reduced-price Lunch by May 6 May Be Eligible for Pandemic EBT</u>

Students that qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits may be potentially eligible for pandemic EBT (P-EBT). P-EBT can help individuals purchase food if their children have temporarily lost access to free or reduced-price meals due to school closures from COVID-related emergencies, or other COVID-related school absences during the 2021-2022 school year. During the 2021-22 school year, all students, regardless of income status, receive free lunch each day they attend school. However, this does not automatically give students free-reduced status, nor qualify students for P-EBT.

On April 20th, we sent an email which included a letter with your student(s) eligibility status (free, reduced, or paid). If your students already qualify for free-reduced meals, DO NOT submit another application. We will send you an email within a few weeks with a link to apply for benefits. If your students have PAID lunch status but you believe your household might qualify for free-reduced meals, we encourage you to submit an application before May 6, 2022.
